The School District of Palm Beach County was awarded a Project Aware Grant to focus on Youth Mental Health First Aid (YMHFA) from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA). The project will provide training in Youth Mental Health First Aid (YMHFA) to teachers and adults in the community who interact with youth. The three year grant aims to train 2,275 individuals who will become First Aiders. These individuals will be trained by a group of 14 instructors which includes school district, non-profit and government personnel. There are two goals the project aims to accomplish: 1.) train a variety of adults in the county who work with youth 2.) increase the number of individuals referred to mental health or related services. Ultimately, the project will address behavioral health disparities by increasing mental health literacy among adults and increasing referrals of youth. Project Aware will serve middle and high school students throughout the County and the Department of Safe Schools will oversee the grant. COLLEGE-CAREER READINESS

The more students learn, the more they earn. Not only that, improved job opportunity and security accompany increased educational levels. This is not limited to 4 year colleges or universities. Postsecondary education includes 2 year degree programs, vocational training programs, and career-technical schools. A recent report from the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity listed the 50 fastest growing occupations in Florida. Twenty-nine (29) of those require postsecondary/vocational training and/or an Associate's Degree. Developing college and career readiness does not start in high school. Students should develop essential college-career success skills (e.g. learning strategies, social skills, self-management skills, academic mindsets, etc.) from an early, elementary school age. Parents can help children to develop these important skills for learning, for earning, and for living.

- 1. **Develop College and Career Aspirations** Talk to your children about going to college or pursuing a career. Set high expectations and empower them to develop the skills and confidence to overcome obstacles. Share your story.
- 2. **Academic Planning** Encourage your children to always do their best in school and challenge them to take rigorous classes.
- 3. **Extracurricular Engagement -** Being involved in clubs, activities and sports inside and outside of school provide children the opportunity to develop social skills, leadership skills and talents. Help your children to pursue activities beyond the regular school day.
- 4. **College and Career Exploration** Create opportunities to learn more about the many career and postsecondary training options available to your children.
- 5. **College and Career Planning** It is never too early to start a family plan for college-career exploration, application, and expenses.

EXCEPTIONAL STUDENT EDUCATION (ESE)

In 2014, the Florida legislature made several changes related to graduation requirements and secondary transition for students with disabilities. The special diploma was repealed, new graduation requirements for certain students with disabilities were established to enable all students to earn a standard diploma, and some transition IEP items and transition decisions now require parental approval. 

SAFE SCHOOLS - MCKINNEY-VENTO PROGRAM

The McKinney-Vento Program (MVP) team consists of the homeless liaison along with social service and education professionals who work to address problems often faced by homeless children and youth in enrolling, attending, and succeeding in school. The team ensures the educational rights and services of these students district-wide. During the 2015 school year almost 4,000 students were identified. Students are considered to be experiencing homelessness if they live in a shelter, motel, vehicle, campground, on the street, in abandoned buildings, or are doubled-up with relatives or friends due to a hardship. SCHOOL POLICE - HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS

As we prepare for a much-needed break, we recognize the importance of contributing to the safety and security of our community during the holiday season. We can never be too careful or too aware. Please share this information with family, friends and neighbors.

- If you need to go shopping, be Keep a record of all of your credit aware of parking lot lights and try to park in a well-lit areas close to your destination.
- Avoid parking next to vans, trucks with camper shells, or cars with darkly tinted windows.
- Shop with a family member or
- Lock your valuables in your trunk − do not leave bags or items in plain sight where a thief will be tempted to break into your car.
- Before leaving the store be sure you have your keys in your hand so that you can get into your car quickly.
- Keep a secure hold on your purse, handbag and parcels. Do not put them down or on top of the car • in order to open the door.
- When approaching or leaving your vehicle, be aware of your surroundings.
- Do not approach your car alone if there are suspicious people in the area. If you feel unsafe, ask mall or store security for an escort • before leaving your shopping location.
- Avoid wearing expensive jewelry.

- Notify the credit card issuer immediately if your credit card is lost, stolen or misused.

- Be extra careful if you do carry a wallet or purse. They are the prime targets of criminals in crowded shopping areas, transportation terminals, bus stops, on buses and other rapid transit.
- Teach your child to go to a store clerk and ask for help in case your child is separated from you.
- Never allow children to make unaccompanied trips to the restroom.
- Children should never be allowed to go to the car alone and they should never be left alone in the car.
- Teach children their full name, address and telephone number to give to police officers or mall security.
- When leaving home for an extended time, have a neighbor or family member watch your house and pick up your newspapers and mail.
- Indoor and outdoor lights should be on an automatic timer.
- Large displays of holiday gifts should not be visible through the windows and doors of your home.
- Be sure your Christmas tree is mounted on a sturdy base so children, elderly persons or family pets cannot pull it over on themselves.
